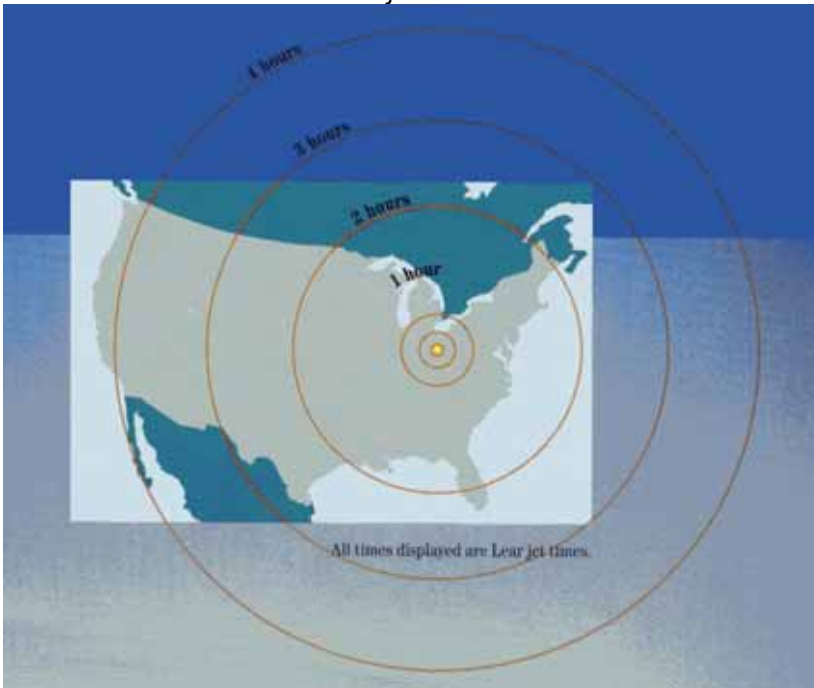


## BUTLER COUNTY, OHIO AIRPORTS

Butler County is 30 miles from two international airports—Greater Cincinnati – Northern Kentucky Airport and Dayton International Airport—and is 40 miles from hubs for DHL, FedEx, UPS, and Emery. Butler County Also has two regional airports, [Hook Field](#) in Middletown and [Butler County Regional Airport](#) in Hamilton, that can accommodate business jets.



In 2003, the International Air Transport Association survey of travelers ranked Cincinnati International #1 in the nation for overall passenger convenience. Dayton International Airport (DIA) according to the Airports Council International-North America is 10th fastest growing of 175 airports it surveyed. Last year, local passenger volume grew 14.1 percent, to 2.6 million total passengers. DIA is the North American hub for Menlo Forwarding (formerly Emery Worldwide) making it the nation's 10th and the world's 15th busiest cargo and freight airport.

### Airlines serving Cincinnati:

Air France, American Airlines, Comair, Continental, Delta Airlines, Northwest Airlines, TransMeridian, USA 3000, United Airlines, USAirways Express.

Cincinnati-Northern Kentucky International Airport (CVG), which is 30 miles south of Butler County, has 655 daily departures including 135 non-stop

flights, five of which serve European destinations. "Our ability to fly non-stop to so many destinations is truly a strategic advantage," says Charlotte Otto, senior vice president of global external relations for Proctor & Gamble.

At CVG, customer service is just as important as the quantity of service. In 2004 it ranked #1 among U.S. airports based on an independent SkyTrax survey. J.D. Powers and Associates ranked CVG second among major U.S. airports.

Dayton International Airport, located near the intersections of Interstates 70 and 75 in Vandalia, offers more than 85 flights a day, with non-stop service to more than 22 domestic and foreign cities. More than two million passengers travel through the airport each year. Dayton International Airport is the North American Hub for Emery Worldwide, a Consolidated Freightways Company, making Dayton the nation's 10th busiest and the world's 15th busiest cargo and freight airports.

Both the Cincinnati and Dayton International Airports are served by all the major air cargo and air freight companies. All of the major freight forwarders have offices in the region.
